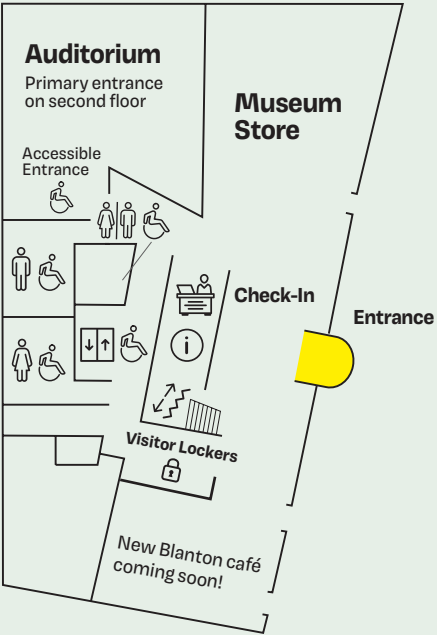

## Second Saturdays

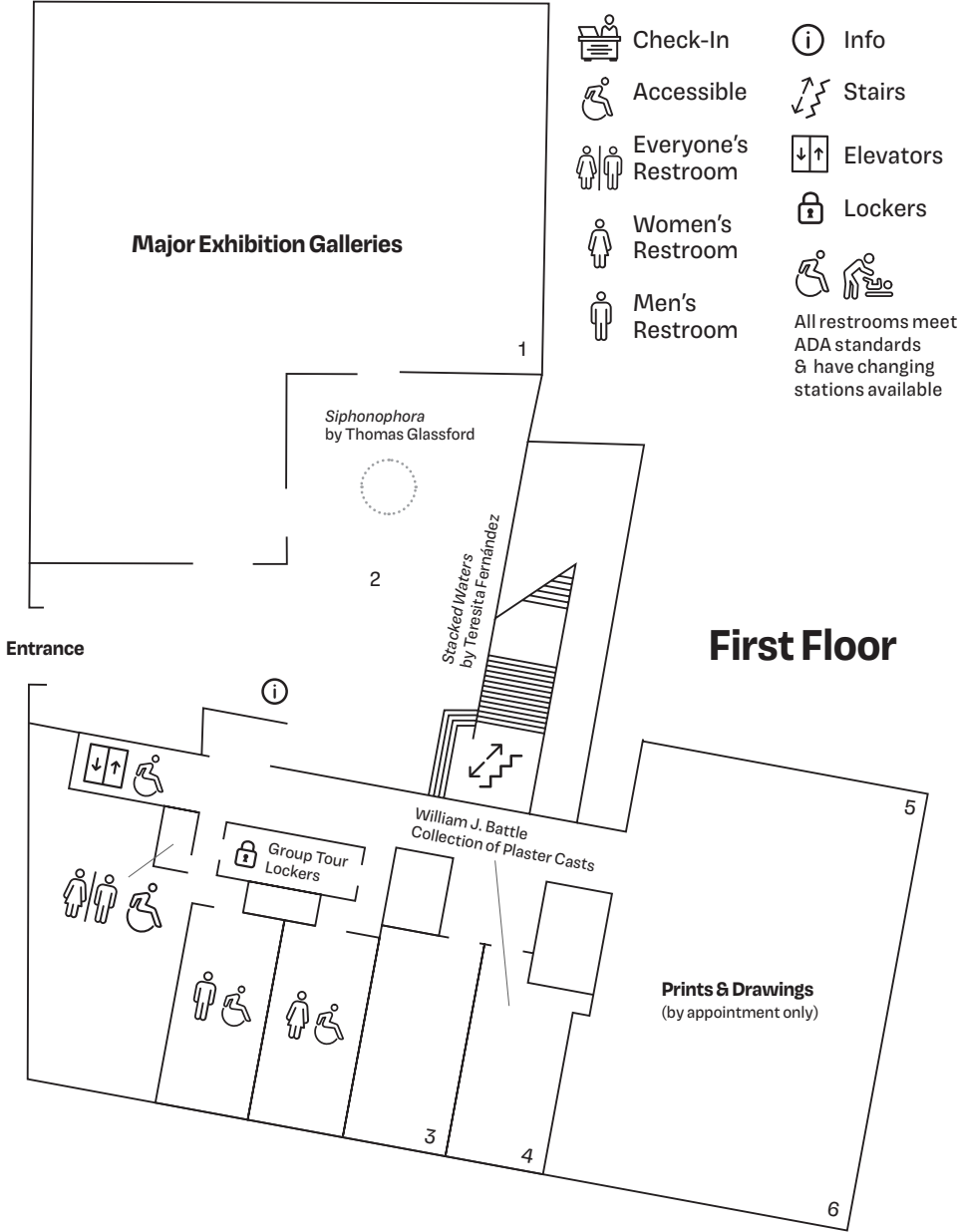

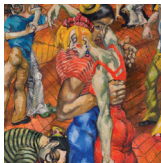

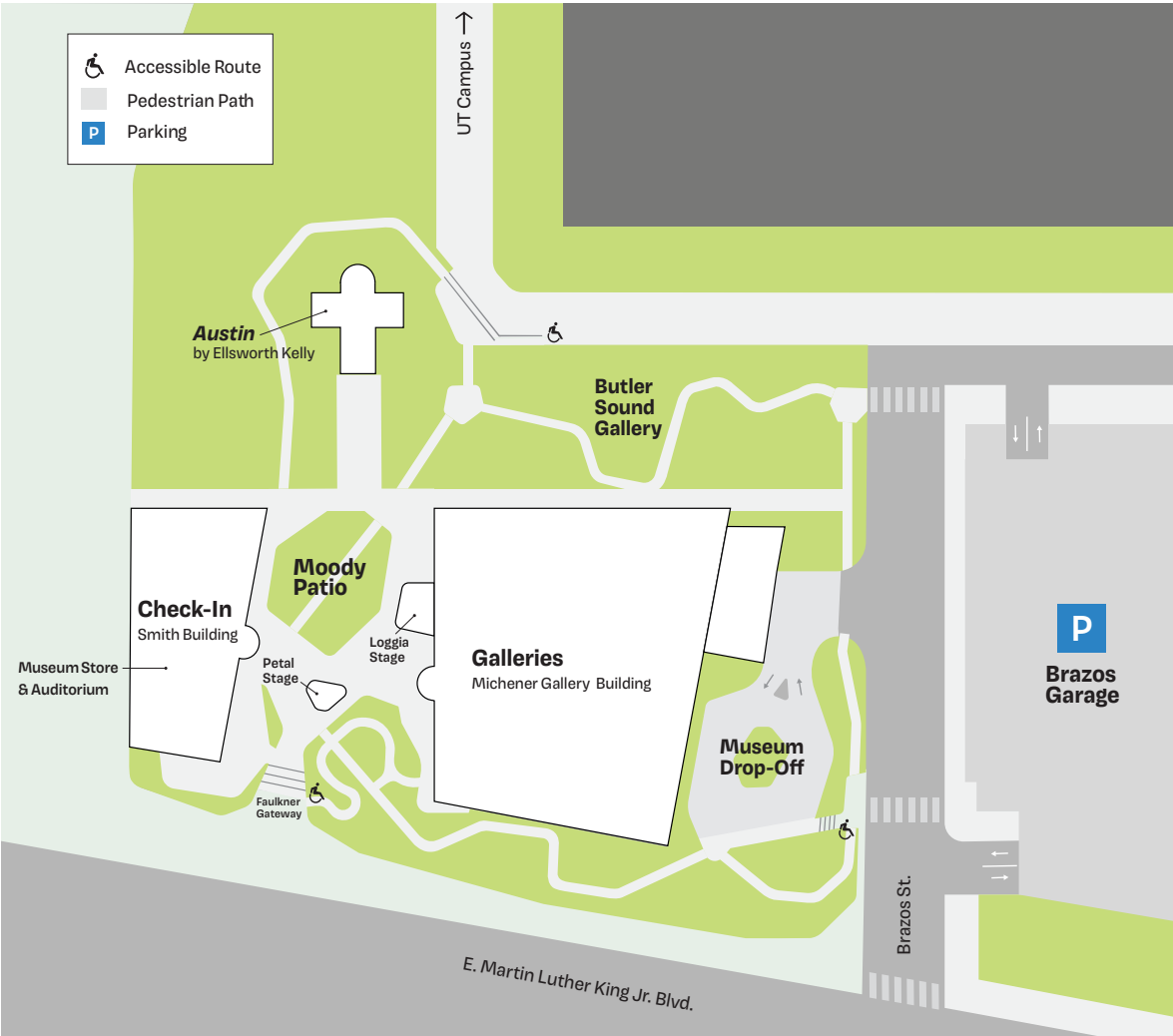

Butler Sound Gallery  
Step into our outdoor gallery dedicated to sound art (one of the first in the world!). The inaugural artwork, *Landscape Soundings* by Bill Fontana, is a sonic portrait of Austin and Texas Hill Country. Hear bats, birds, natural springs, and more during museum hours.



Austin by Ellsworth Kelly  
The monumental limestone structure is both a work of art and a building. Explore colorful light streaming in from 33 stained-glass windows, a freestanding redwood totem, and 14 marble panels. Scan this code to access bilingual audio guides and transcriptions.
